

## Conflict Minerals Policy

GLOBALFOUNDRIES is aware of the concerns that sourcing of certain metals (Tantalum, Tin, Tungsten and Gold) used in electronics products may contribute to financing the armed conflict marked by severe human right abuses in conflict regions in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and adjoining countries

To address these serious concerns GLOBALFOUNDRIES has established a conflict minerals policy prohibiting the use of these metals if their sourcing contributes to financing armed conflict and human right abuses in the conflict regions in the DRC and adjoining countries.

We have implemented due diligence procedures to evaluate the smelters and sources of these metals within our supply chain with the goal to establish a DRC conflict-free supply chain. GLOBALFOUNDRIES is a member of the CFSI (Conflict-Free Sourcing Initiative). Our due diligence program is based on the work done by the CFSI's Conflict-Free Smelter Program (CFSP).

We have communicated the following requirements to our affected suppliers:

- Adopt and commit to a conflict-free supply chain policy;
- Apply due diligence to only source from smelters that are assessed as conflict-free under the CFSP (Conflict-Free Smelter Program) by 31 December 2015;
- Provide smelter sourcing information using the CFSI Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT).
